### **June 7, 2020, Sunday**

Our charming adventure begins as we take an overnight flight to Dublin. Enjoy in-flight entertainment and meal service as you start your Irish dream vacation.

### **June 8, 2020, Monday - Dublin**

Welcome to Dublin! Upon arrival, we meet our private tour guide and take a short drive to the center to enjoy a panoramic tour of the city. For such a small city, Dublin's got a big past. The iconic city has survived Viking attacks, a devastating fire, and even the plague. It is also the founder of one of the oldest universities in Europe, Trinity College, and is home to Ireland's legendary brew, Guinness. We will swing by the Docklands, which are rich in maritime history, engineering triumphs, and landmark architecture. We will also visit St. Patrick's Cathedral. Built in honor of Ireland's patron saint, Saint Patrick's Cathedral stands adjacent to the famous well where tradition has it Saint Patrick baptized converts on his visit to Dublin. Check in to our centrally located hotel and the afternoon and evening are yours to explore more of Dublin, or simply sit in a cafe with a cup of Irish coffee and enjoy a couple of hours of people-watching! ### **June 9, 2020, Tuesday - Dublin**

After a rich breakfast, we will visit Trinity College and admire the Book of Kells. Located in the heart of Dublin city, a walk through the cobbled stones of Trinity College, Dublin will bring us back to the 18th century, when the magnificent Old

Library building was constructed and which displays the Book of Kells, Ireland's greatest cultural treasure and the world's most famous medieval manuscript. The 9th-century book is a richly decorated copy of the four Gospels of the life of Jesus Christ. Later we will make a stop at a local cheese shop to taste the wonderful Irish cheeses. The afternoon and evening is at leisure for shopping and to enjoy more of the charming capital. B | T

### **June 10, 2020, Wednesday - Gardens, Wools & Abbeys**

We are getting ready to depart Dublin and discover the breathtaking Powerscourt Gardens - voted No. 3 Garden in the World by National Geographic! The Gardens stretch over 47 acres and offer a sublime blend of formal gardens, sweeping terraces, statues and ornamental lakes, secret hollows and rambling walks. Next, visit Avoca for a unique shopping experience of the best Ireland has to offer! Our next stop is at Jerpoint Park to enjoy a guided tour of the footprints of a deserted medieval town dating back to 1200AD. Tradition in these parts tells that the earthly remains of St. Nicholas were secretly removed from Bari by returning crusader knights, who brought them back to Newtown Jerpoint for safe keeping. ### **June 11, 2020, Thursday - Cork to Galway**

After a hearty breakfast, we are off to one of Cork's most beloved spots. The English Market, an indoor food market in the city center, is considered one of the best-covered markets in the entire UK and Ireland. The origins of the English Market trace back to the times of King James I in 1610, some four hundred years previously and has been officially trading since 1788. A mix of traditional Cork fare and exciting new foods from afar, combined with long-standing family-run stalls, contribute to the unique appeal and atmosphere. It is time to leave Cork and head north towards Galway, with a stop for lunch on our way. Next in our itinerary is Ireland's iconic Bunnah Beg Castle, named after the river Raithe which runs alongside this strategic battlement. The spot on which this castle stands has been occupied for over 1,000 years by the Vikings to the Normans, great Irish Earls and noble Lords and Ladies. Graciously restored in the 1960s and furnished by Lord Gort's magnificent collection of medieval furniture and furnishings, this is your chance to experience a window on Ireland's past and explore the acclaimed 15th - century Bunnah Beg Castle. ### **June 12, 2020, Friday - Cliffs of Moher**

We head out to the famous Cliffs of Moher, scenic cliffs stretching 700 feet over the rugged Atlantic coast. The cliffs are



Ireland's most visited natural attraction with a magical vista that will capture your heart - their beauty is incomparable! We make a stop for lunch at our favorite smokehouse to sample the silky, smoky texture of smoked Irish organic salmon. We will discover the mystery of salmon smoking and the secret of how smoked salmon is handcrafted. Enjoy mosaics that tell the story of the "Salmon of Knowledge", marvel at the nostalgic atmosphere and smell the oak smoke as soon as you come through the door. Enjoy an afternoon in Galway among the quaint shops and cafés. Join us for an optional dinner in one of Galway's finest eateries. B | L

### **June 13, 2020, Saturday - Connemara**

Today we will visit one of the most beautiful places in the region: Kylemore Abbey and its Victorian Walled Garden. Both a castle and a Benedictine abbey, the majestic Kylemore was a gift of love from a romantic Irishman to his beloved wife, woven with tales of tragedy and romance. Today Kylemore Abbey is owned and run by the Benedictine community who have been in residence here since 1920. Indulge in the unique craft shop, admire the Kylemore Abbey Pottery and taste the award-winning chocolates handmade by the Benedictine nuns. Ireland, for centuries, has been famous for its woolens and we will stop to get an insight into the importance of sheep and wool in Connemara's past. Learn the history of sheep farming, local woolen

industry and the process of how sheep's fleece is made into cloth. Next, we will discover the rich history of Ashford Castle, extending back to 1228 and once home to the famous Guinness family. We will enjoy lunch at the castle, followed by a private Hawk Walk. This will give you the incredible opportunity to fly your very own Harris Hawks under the guidance of your instructor. After you have been introduced to your hawks you'll set off into the magnificent woodlands to fly your hawks, as they follow you from tree to tree through the woods before swooping down to land on your gloved fist. You will learn about the Hawks' exceptional eyesight, their speed, and agility. This is truly a once-in-a-lifetime experience. Galway is at your leisure tonight. B | L

### **June 14, 2020, Sunday - Return to Dublin**

We leave Galway and make our way back to Dublin with a couple of very exciting stops on the way. Clonmacnoise is our first stop, an ancient monastic site near Shannonbridge. A walk amongst the peaceful stone ruins of this famous area will conjure images of the saints and scholars of Ireland's renowned Golden Age of learning and the two complete High Crosses will simply take your breath away. We make a stop for lunch in Kilbeggan, a picturesque town famous for its old whiskey distillery. Last stop is the fantastic Irish National Stud & Gardens. A base plan coverage is offered from \$171 per person (covers land up to \$3,000 per person).
