We will visit museums, Bavarian style shops in the German settlement of Frankenmuth, dine at the top of the world in the Skylon Tower and so much more.

And, of course in our traverse around the Great Lakes Area we will end up at the majestic Niagara Falls where we'll spend two nights and see the falls and area scenic sights. Come, join me, solo or two-by-two, on this Grand and historic adventure with Women of Nebraska.

October 8, 2021 (Friday) - Arrival to Dearborn, Detroit

Our wonderful adventure begins as we fly to Detroit, MI, where we will spend our first two nights. Upon arrival, we meet our local tour director who will be traveling alongside from our arrival to our departure from Buffalo, NY. We have arranged a transfer to our hotel in Dearborn and the remainder of the day is yours to relax and unwind. A welcome dinner is included tonight. D

What's so special about Dearborn?

Dearborn has a large community of descendants of ethnic Europeans who arrived as immigrants from the mid-19th into the 20th century. Their ancestors generally first settled in Detroit: Irish, German, Italians, and Polish. It is also a center of a Maltese American settlement from the quaint Mediterranean island of Malta. Different languages have been spoken for ages in this area and when the kids played out in the streets, the mothers would come out to call them in for the night in many different languages.

But there's more to Dearborn! Auto pioneer Henry Ford wasn't a home builder, but when his workers in Dearborn needed housing a century ago, the automaker switched gears. He built houses. Between 1919 and 1920, Ford and his team built 250 homes just west of downtown Dearborn, in what is now known as the Ford Homes Historic District, to provide housing for workers at a nearby tractor plant. The Ford Homes Historic District has its roots in World War I. With Britain engulfed in the war and Germans blocking the country's food supply chain, tractors were in demand for the British to grow their own food. Few were being built, so Henry Ford was asked to build tractors in quantity. He built the Fordson Tractor Plant which opened in 1917, employing 4,000 workers. But housing was an issue. Rents were very high in Dearborn and workers often had to ride into the city from Detroit on the interurban railway for an hour. Ford's personal secretary, Ernest Liebold, had a suggestion: Ford should build houses for his workers. And so he did!

October 9, 2021 (Saturday) - Ford Factory and Village

After a hearty breakfast, we will take a short drive to visit the famous River Rouge* Plant, a modern marvel of 21st-century manufacturing where Ford F-150 trucks are built. The Plant was built between 1917 and 1925 and became the model for assembly-line production, turning parts at one end into finished cars at the other!

Next, we will visit the Henry Ford Museum. This museum is known as the greatest auto collection documenting the American experience. See the Rosa Parks bus, the chair in which Abraham Lincoln was assassinated, the limousine where President Kennedy was shot, and much more. We will also visit Greenfield Village, established

by Henry Ford in 1929 as a living history museum to celebrate American spirit from Pioneer days to modern times. Naturally, we will ride in a Model T (or "Tin Lizzie") car today, generally regarded as the first affordable automobile, which made car travel available to middle-class Americans. The late afternoon and evening are yours to enjoy at leisure. Even if you are not a car buff by nature, we guarantee you will find your drive today! B

***The history of River Rouge:**



After having been stationed as the commandant at Fort Michilimackinac, the most important of the outer fur trading posts between Quebec and Montreal, French Lt. Antoine de la Mothe Cadillac (yes, quite a name!) devised a plan to preserve the French fur trade in the Americas. In hopes of preventing the English from gaining control over the fur trade, Cadillac returned to France to garner backing for his idea which centered on developing a new fort where Lake St. Clair pours into Lake Erie. He believed the location to be extremely strategic as it would give France control of the entire upper lakes region as the most efficient form of inland transportation utilized waterways. Cadillac received the necessary backing from the French government under the rule of Louis XIV, and in 1701, he landed at what is now recognized as the city of Detroit (French for "détroit" meaning "the strait"). As the Detroit settlement began to expand, it did so along the rivers, north and south, along the Detroit River and the Rouge River (French for "red river"). The descendants of Cadillac and those who first accompanied him, became a large part of the population that made up the area that was to become River Rouge.

October 10, 2021 (Sunday) - Mackinac Island

We enjoy a rich breakfast before our journey continues northbound to Mackinac Island. Today's adventure includes a 16-minute ferry ride in the shadow of the Mackinac Bridge, one of the world's most beautiful bridges. Arriving you will be greeted with the sights and sounds of the Victorian era, where transportation was by horse-drawn carriage or bicycle. We get ready to step back in time for two nights at The Grand Hotel, Mackinac's finest and most famous resort property. Lunch is served en route today and our beautiful hotel provides an elegant dining experience this evening. Welcome to Mackinac Island! B | L | D

October 11, 2021 (Monday) - Mackinac Island

Breakfast with the most amazing views is served before we are off to a scenic, horse-drawn carriage tour of the island and the West Bluff Victorian homes. Don't be camera-shy; today is day to get some of the best photos on this entire journey. The afternoon is free to enjoy and explore the quaint town and its simple life. Eighty percent of Mackinac Island is parkland and if a golf cart is too modern for you, how about getting around by horse and buggy or by a rented bike? Don't forget to swing by one (or more!) of the 14 fudge shops downtown. More



than 10,000 pounds of fudge is daily slabbed on marble allowing the fudge to cool evenly and quickly giving it a unique flavor and creating a great show too. Or visit the fascinating butterfly conservatory, the Wings of Mackinac, to watch the butterflies eat dried fruits and nectar. A lovely experience! Dinner is served at our beautiful hotel. B | D

October 12, 2021 (Tuesday) - Frankenmuth

After breakfast, we will take the ferry back to the mainland. We will cross the Mighty Mac, one of the world's longest suspension bridges, and find ourselves in Frankenmuth a little later in the day. You will love this small city settled by Germans from the Bavarian region. Streets lined with Bavarian-style shops including Bronner's Christmas Wonderland and Frankenmuth River Place with more than forty specialty shops. If you love cheese, a visit to the Cheese Haus is a must, and if you are a pet-lover, you shouldn't miss "Hello Cats and Dogs" featuring an extensive collection of unique items dedicated to cats and dogs. It is such a fun experience and they even have a "Barkery" filled with tasty treats and locally-made puppy pretzel. Ohh, and the Clock Company ... it specializes in authentic, handcrafted German items, including Black Forest cuckoo clocks, miniature clocks, nutcrackers, and holiday ornaments. So, save some space in your bags for this day in Frankenmuth! B

October 13, 2021 (Wednesday) - Niagara Falls

After a filling breakfast, we head east into Ontario, Canada, to the Niagara Falls, one of the seven natural wonders of the world. We make a stop to see and experience the IMAX movie "Niagara: Miracles, Myths & Magic". Next, we are off to enjoy the unique "Journey behind the Falls". We descend 125 feet and through 130-year-old tunnels carved through the bedrock, we reach the observation deck for an up-close (and possibly a little bit wet) view of the falls. To stand at the heart of Niagara, at the foot of this 13-story-tall wonder, will leave you breathless and you will feel the thunderous vibration of the Horseshoe Falls long before you see them. Don't forget the viewing portals cut straight through the rock, offering a once-in-a-lifetime view of one-fifth of the world's freshwater crashing down in front of you. Iconic yellow ponchos are handed out, keeping you dry. Those are recycled after the usage but you'll probably want to take it home as a keepsake. We check in to our hotel in the late afternoon for two nights in Niagara Falls. If you are up to even more today, we recommend a walk on the Rainbow Bridge for more impressive views of the Falls. The walk from one side of the other only takes 5 minutes, it is a short, but stunning, 1,500 feet each way! B

Canadian side is where you get gorgeous panoramas of both the American Falls and the mighty Horseshoe Falls and is definitely the more glamorous side of Niagara Falls, thus our two nights spent on the Canadian side. The water flows from streams and rivers that empty into the Great Lakes, from Lake Superior down through Niagara to Lake Ontario, then into the St. Lawrence River to the Atlantic Ocean.

October 14, 2021 (Thursday) - Niagara Falls

We enjoy our breakfast and then head out to enjoy a day full of incredible Niagara Falls area sightseeing. We will drive the scenic Niagara Parkway with stops at the Hydro Floral Clock and the Horticultural Center. The clock is the largest in the world and has a stunning clockface made of 16,000 carpet bedding plants which are changed twice a year. There is a tower at the back of the clock housing Westminster chimes that greet each quarter-hour. If the door into the tower is open, you can take a glimpse of the clock mechanism and enjoy photographs that show the history of almost every face design all the way back to 1950. We will also drive the Great Gorge River Walk Whirlpool Rapids, Butterfly Conservatory, quaint Niagara-on-the-Lake village, and the Welland ship canal between Erie and Ontario Lakes. A very special farewell dinner is arranged as we ascend Skylon Tower, a revolving restaurant overlooking the Falls. The views don't get any better than this! B | D

October 15, 2021 (Friday) - Return Home

After breakfast, we will motorcoach across the bridge to Niagara Falls, NY, and visit Goat Island, a small island in the middle of the Falls between the Bridal Veil Falls and the Horseshoe Falls. The island got its name from a herd of goats kept by an early pioneer and miller, John Stedman. The animals all died in the terrible winter of 1780, but the name has remained Goat Island ever since, and is a part of the Niagara Falls State Park. Our last adventure is a cruise close to the Falls aboard the famous "Maid of the Mist". The breathtaking, close-up encounter with the awe-inspiring thundering falls is unforgettable. The duration of the boat tour is 20-30 minutes and no matter what you wear today, you will probably get wet, so wear something that dries easily. Our last stop today is at Buffalo airport for our flight back home filled with wonderful memories of a delightful Grand Tour of Macinac Island and Niagara Falls. B
