Dear Friends,

Come join us on a once-in-a-lifetime trip to France to commemorate the 76th anniversary of the end of World War II. The focus will be on the role of the Nebraska National Guards' famed 134th Infantry Regiment and its liberation of the country.

The trip will start off in Normandy along the beaches of D-Day and you will learn about how a Columbus, Nebraska native and soldier revolutionized amphibious warfare. The highlight of this area will be the liberation ceremonies in St. Lo and the touring of the hedgerow sites (Hill 122).

During the trip, we will pay homage to the fallen at Normandy American, Lorraine and Luxembourg American Cemeteries with official party wreath-laying and tours. Next stop will be the city of Nancy and another set of battlefield sites such as Sugar Loaf Hill, Fort Vincent, and the Flavigny Bridge.

Nancy is a beautiful city and promises great nightly entertainment while we are there. Next stop will be the Battle of the Bulge sites in Belgium. Visit historical battlefields around Bastogne: Lutrebois Memorial, Company M Hill, Battle of the Bulge Museum and Memorial. The trip will include scholars and academics on military history of the Nebraska National Guard in World War II. We will also take advantage of wonderful French cuisine, wine and art/culture along the way.

Our French guide is the best in France and has worked with our Nebraska groups in the past. I look forward to seeing you on the trip.



July 14, 2021

Wednesday - Travel to France

Our journey begins as we meet at the Omaha airport to take an overnight flight to Paris. Enjoy in-flight entertainment and meal service as you start your once-in-a-lifetime tour. Meals served onboard the international flight.

July 15, 2021

Thursday - Bayeux

Welcome to France! We are met by our professional tour guide and driver at the airport and we are off towards the Normandy region. On our way, we will make a stop to visit Claude Monet's house and gardens in Giverny. Art lovers will immediately recognize images immortalized in Monet's most beloved paintings such as water lilies, Japanese bridges, and graceful willow trees. Wander around his famous gardens and home where he lived for more than four decades. If time allows, we will make a stop at the Pegasus Bridge to learn about its important role in the morning of D-Day 1940. In the early evening, we arrive at our hotel in Bayeux in time for dinner and then off to bed for a good night's rest. L (lunch boxes) | D

July 16, 2021

Friday - Utah Beach - Sainte-Mère-Église

Breakfast at our hotel. This morning we

head out to Utah Beach to experience Higgins Boat Memorial. We will listen to the story of the Allied invasion of Normandy and the reasons for the success at Utah Beach. The next stop today is at the church of Sainte-Mère-Église to see where Private John Steele's parachute got caught in one of the pinnacles of the church tower, leaving him hanging on the side of the church. Lunch is served in the village before we pay a visit to the Airborne Museum and make a stop at the Iron Mike statue, dedicated to the memory of the soldiers of the American airborne troops. We head back to picturesque Bayeux for a late afternoon and evening at leisure. If time allows, this is your chance to visit the Bayeux Tapestry Museum. Dinner at leisure. B | L

July 17, 2021

Saturday - Arromanches-les-Bains - Colleville-sur-Mer - Pointe du Hoc - Omaha Beach

After a hearty breakfast, we take a short drive to Arromanches-les-Bains to discover the Mulberry Harbors considered one of the greatest engineering feats of WWII, the temporary mobile harbors for unloading troops, vehicles, and supplies. Omaha Beach, the codename for one of the five sectors of the Allied invasion of German-occupied France in the Normandy landing on June 6th, 1944, is next. We will visit the American cemetery of Colleville-sur-Mer, the first American cemetery on

European soil in WWII, and a wreath-laying ceremony is arranged. Pointe du Hoc will make a special impression on you before we head back to enjoy the evening in Bayeux. B | L

July 18, 2021

Sunday - Hedgerow Tour - Hill 122 - St. Lo Celebrations

Breakfast at our hotel. We head out for a very emotional experience; the Hill 122 and Hedgerow Tour. Then, continue to St. Lo to spend the day with the ceremonies of the liberation in the city. Lunch is served in company with our St. Lo Rotary Club friends; yet another emotional touch of the day. There will be plenty of time to reflect on history today, guaranteed! We return to Bayeux in the early evening. B | L

July 19, 2021

Monday - Mortain - Calvados Tastings

After an enjoyable breakfast, we take a good hour's drive to the mountain village of Mortain. In August 1944, after the Normandy invasion of June and subsequent breakout at St. Lo, in July, the German High Command was prepared for a massive counter-offensive in an attempt to throw the Allied Armies back into the sea. We will learn everything about the importance of the Battle of Mortain today. Lunch is served in the village. On our return back to Bayeux, we will swing by a local Calvados producers in the area. Calvados is the special brandy made



from the crisp and sweet Normandy apples. This is the perfect ending to our day. The evening is yours in Bayeux. B | L | T

July 20, 2021
Tuesday - Amiens - Nancy

We say farewell to Bayeux this morning. Today is one of the longer driving days as we head east via Amien, with a stop for lunch near the largest cathedral in France, to Nancy which is reached in the evening. Nancy is the beautiful capital of the Dukes of Lorraine and known throughout the world for its array of eighteenth-century architecture in Place Stanislas, Place de la Carrière and Place d'Alliance. The city is listed as a UNESCO World Heritage site since 1983. Even more than being a town dedicated to art (which it is!), Nancy has turned to "live" culture, with a national opera, a ballet, a symphony- and opera orchestra. Dinner is served upon our arrival. In the evening, do not miss the spectacular light-show at Place Stanislas. B | L | D

July 21, 2021
Wednesday - Nancy - Lorraine American Museum - Mayor's Ceremony

The morning is dedicated to the visits of Flavigny Bridge and the Lorraine American Museum located in Vezelise, a short drive from Nancy. We will return back to Nancy in time for a leisurely lunch prior to a very special ceremony held exclusively for us by the mayor of Nancy in the stunning

town hall. This visit is definitely one of the highlights of the tour. The evening is yours to enjoy in beautiful Nancy. B

July 22, 2021
Thursday - Battle Site Tour

After a filling breakfast, we are ready to head out to the Lorraine American Cemetery and Memorial in Saint-Avold. A wreath-laying ceremony has been arranged. Next stop is in the village of Armaucourt with the plaque of orphans of the 134th Infantry Regiment. A leisurely lunch stop is included along our route today. Sugarloaf Hill Monument is up next before we head back to Nancy to enjoy an afternoon and evening at leisure. B

July 23, 2021
Friday - Lutrebois - Bastogne - Luxembourg

Our day is dedicated to the Battle of Lutrebois and the Battle of the Bulge. We depart from Nancy in the early morning and our first stop today is Lutrebois. A stop at a very special site on the outskirts of the village is included. We will visit the impressive Bastogne War Museum where we will have time for a leisurely lunch before we continue to Luxembourg with a stop and a wreath-laying ceremony at the American Cemetery of Luxembourg. Dinner is served at our elegant hotel in the center of town. B | D

July 24, 2021
Saturday - Reims - Paris

We say goodbye to Luxembourg and begin our journey towards Paris. Our route takes us via Reims, the capital of the "ultimate in bottled glamour"; Champagne. Time for lunch and a glass of bubbly, before we arrive at our hotel in the early afternoon. Our farewell dinner tonight is a one-of-a-kind as we enjoy a Seine River cruise to admire the "City of Lights" by night.
