Our charming adventure begins as we take an overnight flight to Dublin. Enjoy inflight entertainment and meal service as you start your Irish dream vacation.

August 14, 2024, Wednesday

Welcome to Dublin! Upon arrival, we meet our private tour guide and take a short drive to the center to enjoy a panoramic tour of the city. For such a small city, Dublin's got a big past. The iconic city has survived Viking attacks, devastating fires, and even the plague. It is also the founder of one of the oldest universities in Europe, Trinity College, and is home to Ireland's legendary brew, Guinness. We will swing by the Docklands, rich in maritime history, engineering triumphs, and landmark architecture. We will also visit St. Patrick's Cathedral. Built in honor of Ireland's patron saint, Saint Patrick's Cathedral stands adjacent to the famous well where tradition has it Saint Patrick baptized converts on his visit to Dublin. Check in to our centrally located hotel, and the afternoon and evening are yours to explore more of Dublin, or simply sit in a cafe with a cup of Irish coffee and enjoy a couple of hours of people-watching! After a rich breakfast, we will visit Trinity College and admire the Book of Kells. Located in the heart of Dublin city, a walk through the cobblestoned lanes of



Trinity College will bring us back to the 18th century when the magnificent Old Library building was constructed and displays the Book of Kells, Ireland's greatest cultural treasure and the world's most famous medieval manuscript. The 9th-century book is a richly decorated copy of the four Gospels of the life of Jesus Christ. Later we will make a stop at a very special grocery store to taste the local Irish cheeses. The afternoon and evening are at leisure for shopping and to enjoy more of the charming capital. B | S

August 16, 2024, Friday Gardens, Wools & Abbeys

Getting ready to discover the breathtaking Powerscourt Gardens - voted "No. 3 Garden in the World" by National Geographic! The Gardens stretch over 47 acres and offer a sublime blend of formal gardens, sweeping terraces, statues and ornamental lakes, secret hollows, and rambling walks. Next, visit Avoca for a unique shopping experience of the best Ireland has to offer! We continue to Jerpoint Park to enjoy a guided tour of the footprints of a deserted medieval town dating back to 1200 AD. Tradition in these parts tells that the earthly remains of St. Nicholas were secretly removed from Bari by returning crusader knights, who brought them back to Newtown Jerpoint for safekeeping. The story gets even better when told by Joe while Maeve prepares and serves her homemade scones and tea in the barn! A visit to remember! We arrive in Cork for a good night's rest. B | T | L



August 17, 2024, Saturday Cork to Galway

After a hearty breakfast, we are off to Cork's most beloved spot, The English Market. This indoor food market in the city center is considered one of the bestcovered markets in the entire UK and Ireland. The origins of the English Market trace back to the times of King James I in 1610, some four hundred years previously, and has been officially trading since 1788. A mix of traditional Cork fare and exciting new foods from afar and long-standing family-run stalls contribute to the unique appeal and atmosphere. Then, it is time to leave Cork and head towards Galway, with a stop for lunch on our way. Next is Ireland's iconic Bunratty Castle, named after the river Raite, which runs alongside this strategic battlement. The spot on which this castle stands has been occupied for over 1,000 years by the Vikings, the Normans, great Irish Earls, and noble Lords and Ladies. Graciously restored in the 1960s and furnished by Lord Gort's magnificent collection of medieval furniture and furnishings, this is your chance to experience a window on Ireland's past and explore the acclaimed 15th-century Bunratty Castle. Arrive at Galway for a relaxing evening. B | L

August 18, 2024, Sunday Cliffs of Moher - Salmon - Sheeps

We head out to the famous Cliffs of Moher, scenic cliffs stretching 700 feet over the rugged Atlantic coast. The cliffs are







Ireland's most visited natural attraction, with a magical vista that will capture your heart! We stop at our favorite smokehouse for lunch to sample the silky, smoky texture of smoked Irish organic salmon. We will discover the mystery of salmon smoking and the secret of how smoked salmon is handcrafted. Enjoy mosaics that tell the story of the "Salmon of Knowledge," marvel at the nostalgic atmosphere, and smell the oak smoke as soon as you come through the door. August 19, 2024, Monday Connemara - Kylemore Abbey - Ashford Castle - Hawk Walk

Today we will visit one of the most beautiful places in the region: Kylemore Abbey and its Victorian Walled Garden. Both a castle and a Benedictine abbey, the majestic Kylemore was a gift of love from a romantic Irishman to his beloved wife, woven with tales of tragedy and romance. Today Kylemore Abbey is owned and run by the Benedictine community, who have been in residence here since 1920. Indulge in the unique craft shop, admire the Kylemore Abbey Pottery, and taste the award-winning chocolates handmade by the Benedictine nuns. Next, we will discover the rich history of Ashford Castle, extending back to 1228 and once home to the famous Guinness family. We will enjoy an exceptional and delightfully elegant lunch at the castle, followed by a private Hawk Walk. This will give you the incredible opportunity to fly your very own Harris Hawk under the guidance of our instructors. After you have been introduced to your hawk, you will set off into the magnificent woodlands to fly your bird, as it follows you from tree to tree through the woods before swooping down to land on your gloved fist. You will learn about the Hawks' exceptional eyesight, their speed, and agility. This is truly a oncein-a-lifetime experience. Galway is at your leisure tonight. B | L

August 20, 2024, Tuesday

Clonmacnoise - Irish National Stud - Dublin

We leave Galway and make our way back to Dublin, with a couple of fascinating stops on the way. Clonmacnoise is our first stop. Never heard of this place? Well, it is an ancient monastic site near Shannonbridge. We will take a walk amongst this captivating area's peaceful stone ruins, conjuring images of the saints and scholars of Ireland's renowned Golden Age of Learning. The two complete High Crosses will take your breath away, quaranteed! We stop for lunch before our last stop at the Irish National Stud and Gardens. This state-owned commercial stud farm also incorporates the worldfamous Japanese Gardens, the wild Irish St. Fiachra's Garden, as well as the Irish Horse Museum and Living Legends.
