# September 5, 2025 - Friday

Traveling to Greece

Our trip of a lifetime begins as we take an overnight flight to Athens, Greece. Enjoy in-flight entertainment and meal service as you start your dream vacation.

# September 6, 2025 - Saturday Athens

Welcome to Athens! Upon arrival, we meet our private tour guide, who will accompany us throughout the trip. We are off to experience some of the most incredible sights in history. Our first stop is at the nearby Thorikos Theater, the first theatre in the world. Let your imagination wander as we take a closer look at this magical site! We continue to Cape Sounion with the impressive Temple of Poseidon rising above the Aegean Sea. A seaside lunch is served before we reach Athens in the afternoon. Athens is one of the oldest cities in the world, full of myths, mysteries, and legends. The city is home to many sacred ancient sites, monuments, and landmarks - a fusion of old and new and a buzzing cosmopolitan metropolis. Check in to our hotel for an evening at leisure to relax and unwind. If you are still awake, take an evening stroll by the Acropolis; it's right next

After a delightful breakfast, we head out to discover Athens, the cradle of Western civilization as we know it today. Founded seven thousand years ago, the city flourished in the fifth century BC when Athenian democracy was practiced in the Bouletarion (council chamber) and open discussion was encouraged in the Agora (marketplace). A short distance by foot takes us to the Acropolis, dominated by the Parthenon and built as a temple to Athena in the 5th century BC. From the top of the hill, you will see the Agora, where Socrates,



Plato, and Aristotle strolled. We will take a closer look at the Theatre of Dionysus, dating back to the 6th century BC. The origins of Greek theater lie in the festivities of the followers of Dionysus, the god of fertility and wine, and the cult around Dionysus has some interesting stories to tell. Lunch is served at a local restaurant before we continue by motorcoach through the city to see the House of Parliament at Syntagma Square, the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier, the Public Library, the University, and the Panathenaic Stadium, where the first Olympics of the modern era were held. The late afternoon and evening are yours to enjoy more of the city. Don't miss the old town "Plaka" with its numerous shops (open till late!), enjoy people-watching, or stroll around the Acropolis hill at sunset. B | L

### September 8, 2025 - Monday

Epidaurus Theater - Nafplion

After a hearty breakfast, we will drive towards Peloponnese. We will stop to admire the canal that connects the Gulf of Corinth with the Saronic Gulf in the Aegean Sea. It's showtime, folks! We arrive at the Ancient Theatre of Epidaurus, a 2,300-yearold stage with legendary acoustics from ancient times. This place will make a memorable impression on all of us as it also hosts the roots of all medicine and the cult of the God of Medicine, Asclepius. If you recall the snake wrapped around the physician staff, today's symbol of the medical profession, this is where it all began. We will visit the museum to discover and learn all about it! Lunch is served under the open skies at a local olive oil press; it doesn't get much better than this! Learn about the important and nutritious value of extra virgin olive oil. We arrive at Nafplion, one of the prettiest cities in Greece. You will love the local shops, cafes, and taverns. An Ouzo tasting is arranged tonight; cheers to our great group, and a good night's rest! BILIT




# September 9, 2025 - Tuesday

Kalamata - Ancient Messini - Olympia We continue our journey to Kalamata (this is the area of the world-famous olives) to visit an exceptional monastery, the Abbey of the Nuns. Founded in 1796, it has been a local space for charity, a safe place during German and Italian occupation, and a shelter for those displaced during the Greek Civil War. A central courtyard filled with orange trees houses the nuns' living areas and a church. The monastery is famous for its silk production, including silk headscarves known to be among the finest in the world, embroideries, and small icons. Lunch is served at a local tavern before we arrive in Messini. The Ancient Theatre of Messini reopened in 2013 after 1,700 years of silence. This theatre plays one of the most significant roles in the Greek world of performances. In the late afternoon, we reach Ancient Olympia, the birthplace of the Olympic Games. The Athletes met here for the first time in 776 BC, and this is where the Olympic Torch is lit every 4th year. This place has an exceptional aura. The evening is yours to enjoy and relax. B | L

## September 10, 2025 - Wednesday Ancient Olympia - Delphi

After breakfast, we are off to the stadium, where it all took place. Listen to the stories of athletic heroes and ancient Gods. We board our motorcoach and cross the impressive Rio-Antirio bridge, the world's longest multi-span cable bridge, to mainland Greece. Next, the Pan-Hellenic sanctuary of Delphi, set in a spectacular landscape at the foot of Mount Parnassos. Considered for many centuries the cultural and religious center of the Hellenic world, it is also home to the "Oracle" and Apollo's Sanctuary, one of the seven wonders of the ancient Greek world. The theater could seat nearly 5000 people and still hosts ancient plays and other cultural events during summertime Our evening is spent in the village. B | L



# September 11, 2025 - Thursday

Thermopylae - Meteora

Enjoy breakfast at our hotel. Then, prepare to learn about a heroic persistence against seemingly impossible odds: the Battle of Thermopylae (480 BC). This is where the Greek army, led by the city-state of Sparta under Leonidas and consisting of about 7,000 men, maintained its position against the Persian army of 300,000. Although the Persian forces won the battle after three days, the delay at Thermopylae allowed the Greek city-states time to prepare for the continuing invasion. Next up, Meteora! The second-biggest and most important group of monasteries in Greece, after those in Mount Athos (which can be visited by men only). The first mention of their history is traced back to the 11th century when the first hermits settled here. UNESCO has characterized the rock monasteries as a unique phenomenon; see and judge for yourself. The monasteries have formed the backdrop to parts of "Games of Thrones," and the James Bond movie "For Your Eyes Only" was filmed here. Enjoy the view of the cliffs by night from the courtyard of our hotels. B | L

# September 12, 2025 - Friday

Skopelos

We are off to Mamma-Mia Island! Today's journey takes us to the port of Volos, where we will take the ferry to Skopelos. Skopelos is home to incredible beaches, and it is worth spending some time beach-hopping and relaxing, taking in the gorgeous surrounding views. One of the most famous beaches on Skopelos Island is Kastani Beach, which is renowned for its use as a filming location in the film Mamma Mia. We will reach our hotel in the afternoon. It is located in the center of Skopelos town and just a short walk from the nearest beach. Enjoy strolling through the quaint village while a local restaurant prepares our dinner.  $B \mid D$ 



# September 13, 2025 - Saturday

Skopelos - Mamma Mia Tour

We head towards the island's west coast to visit the Chapel of St. John (Ioannis), also known as the Mamma Mia wedding church. Once we arrive, we will take our time to climb the 199 steps to the top to enjoy the stunning views and the cooling sea breeze from the top of the rock. The second stop is at Kastani Beach for more in-depth film information and relaxation at the new Kastani Beach bar. We will see where major filming took place for more than ten days and admire this beautiful beach, which proved to be the perfect film location. The last stop is at Agnontas Beach for a swim in the crystalclear waters or, if you prefer, hang out at the local tavern where lunch is served: it's right next to the beach. # September 14, 2025 - Sunday

Skopelos

Breakfast and a day at your own pace. Enjoy everything Skopelos has to offer, stroll, swim, relax, shop for unique souvenirs, or, if you're a wildlife lover, you can take a day trip to Alonissos, the next-door island, to experience the Marine Park. More than 80 types of birds (from tiny warblers to cormorants, gulls, and eagles) and 300 species of fish reside here, along with reptiles and other animals. And the increasingly rare Mediterranean Monk Seal (so-called because of its love of isolation), for which the park is best known. This day is a treat! B

# September 15, 2025 - Monday

After a hearty breakfast, we will begin ourtrip back to Athens. We will take the



ferry to the island of Evia, make a stop for lunch in one of our favorite places, and then cross the bridge from Chalkis to mainland Greece. We will make a short stop at Marathon before reaching Athens in the late afternoon. Enjoy the panoramic views from the roof garden of our hotel and take a last stroll to breathe in the sweet air of Greece. BIL
