Next, we will take a walk down the Royal Mile and visit St. Giles' Cathedral. Nothing comes close to the splendor and magnificence of this cathedral, an utterly sublime example of architectural beauty renowned worldwide for its grandeur, history, and heritage. Free time until the early evening, when we have arranged a special after-hours visit to Holyrood Palace, the King's official residence in Edinburgh! St. Andrews

Today, we will continue our journey to St. Andrews, famous for its university which is attended by many of the Royals and, of course, known as the home of golf. You will have two options in St. Andrews: A day of golfing (full information by March 2025), or join a walking tour of St. Andrews Castle situated on a cliff overlooking the North Sea. Explore the underground mine and countermine, and learn about the castle's turbulent history. Don't miss the bottle dungeon, a deep pit where prisoners were held! We will also visit the Golf Museum. You will enjoy our beautiful hotel overlooking St. Andrews Golf Course. B

Scone Palace - Pitlochry - Inverness

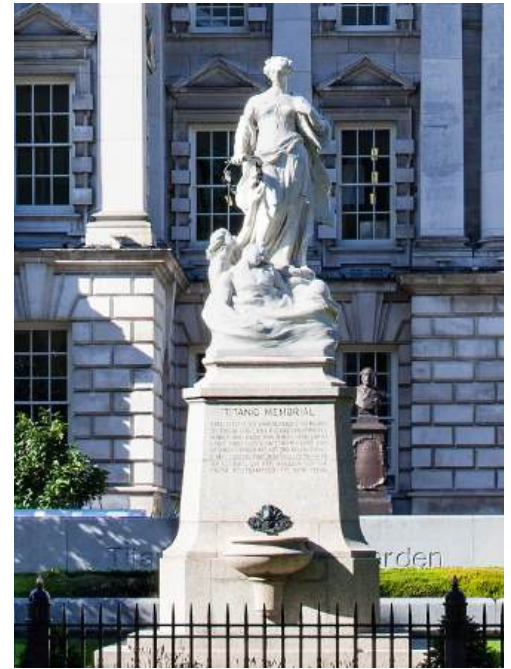

We will stop for a leisurely lunch before visiting the Highland Folk Museum, a living history museum with perfectly preserved houses and artifacts from the Scottish Highlands, a real treat for those interested in the history of rural life. They received a Royal Warrant from HRH The Prince Of Wales for providing Estate Tweed cloth to the Royals. Additionally, these cashmere kings supply top-notch couture houses such as Chanel, Burberry, and Hermès. Then, embark on an immersive journey into the world of whisky at Glen Moray Distillery. Our visit will end with a delightful tasting. Dinner is served at our cozy hotel, and the evening is yours to relax and kick back. B | T | D

April 22, 2026 - Wednesday

Urquhart Castle - Glencoe - Glasgow

We will depart Inverness and head out to explore over 1,000 years of thrilling at one of Scotland's most majestic and dramatic settings, the magnificent Urquhart Castle on the shores of Loch Ness. This is an extraordinary glimpse into medieval Scotland and the lives of its noble characters. Our journey continues via Neptune's Staircase, the longest staircase lock in the UK. Neptune's Staircase allows boats to navigate the significant elevation change between the canal's lower and upper sections, which connects Scotland's east and west coasts. On our way to Glasgow, we will drive through the Glencoe Valley and stop at the Three Sisters of Glencoe viewpoint to take in the breathtaking scenery. Cameras out, Folks! Lunch is enjoyed en route. We will arrive in Glasgow in the late afternoon. Tonight, we will dine in a special restaurant. B | L | D

Our morning starts with a panoramic city tour of Glasgow. This city is full of archi-

Titanic - Monasterboice - Ireland
Our morning begins with a visit to the state-of-the-art Titanic Museum, standing majestically at the head of the slipway where the Titanic was built. Our tour will take us through the shipyard, the decks, get to know the passengers, and learn about the wreck. Next: Welcome to Ireland! Our first stop is at the historic ruins of Monasterboice, an early Christian settlement and an absolute "must-see." It was founded in the late 5th century by Saint Buithe and was an important center of religion and learning until the founding of nearby Mellifont Abbey in 1142. A warm welcome awaits at our hotel in Athlone Springs, where we will enjoy dinner and a leisurely evening. B | D

April 25, 2026 - Saturday

Kylemore Abbey - Ashford Castle - Galway
Today, we will visit one of the most beautiful places in the Connemara region: Kylemore Abbey and its Victorian Walled Garden. Both a castle and a Benedictine abbey, the majestic Kylemore was a gift of love from a romantic Irishman to his beloved wife, woven with tales of tragedy and romance. Today, Kylemore Abbey is owned and run by the Benedictine community, which has been in residence here since 1920. Next, we will discover the rich history of Ashford Castle, extending back to 1228 and once home to the famous Guinness family. We will enjoy an exceptional and

delightfully elegant lunch at the castle, followed by a private hawk walk. This will give you the incredible opportunity to fly your very own Harris Hawk under the guidance of our instructors. After you have been introduced to your hawk, you will set off into the magnificent woodlands to fly your bird as it follows you from tree to tree through the woods before swooping down to land on your gloved fist. You will learn about the Hawks' exceptional eyesight, speed, and agility. This is truly a once-in-a-lifetime experience. Galway is at your leisure tonight. B | L

Chocolate - Cliffs of Moher - Kinsale - Cork
After breakfast, we have a sweet surprise for you: Chocolate! "In the midst of nowhere" lies a small, local chocolate factory. Next, we will make our way to the world-famous Cliffs of Moher, stretching 700 feet over the rugged Atlantic coast. The cliffs are Ireland's most visited natural attraction with a magical vista that has captured the hearts of visitors for hundreds of years. They have majestically faced the Atlantic for over 350 million years, and their beauty is incomparable. We will continue our journey south towards Cork with a lunch stop along the way.
